RECOMMENDATION:

Recommendation to confirm that the City Manager's proposed revisions to the Measure A spending plan in the FY 18 Adjusted Budget conform with the intent of Resolution No. RES-16-0018 prioritizing spending and with the language contained in the ballot measure expressed in Resolution No. RES-16-0017.

DISCUSSION

Summary

Pursuant to the June 7, 2016 Measure A ballot initiative, on January 1, 2017, businesses in the City began to collect an additional one percent in sales tax on all tangible personal property sold at retail in Long Beach. The City Council committed \$47.7 million in anticipated FY 18 Measure A revenues to fund priority public safety maintenance and restorations, as well as capital improvement projects to help rebuild Long Beach's infrastructure and the administration of the Measure A tax.

FY 17 Year-End Performance

As of September 30, 2017, actuals for Measure A revenues, including the accrual for revenues earned in FY 17 but not yet received, were \$38.9 million. These figures were above previous revenue estimates for the ramp up period of Measure A collection. Between surplus revenue and expenditure savings from Measure A administration, there is \$3.3 million in funds above the budgeted amount, which were reserved for appropriation in FY 18.

Revised FY 18 Measure A Budget

On February 20, 2018, City staff recommended that these one-time funds be reserved and appropriated in FY 18 to ensure that key Measure A infrastructure projects are not deferred from the original schedules. Where applicable, the appropriation requests for these proposed uses of the surplus will be brought to the City Council in March. Measure A project budgets were based on preliminary engineering estimates. Since these estimates were developed, detailed design has progressed and economic conditions have driven construction costs up nationwide; therefore, there have been several projects that are projected to exceed budget. These surplus funds will help mitigate some of these cost overruns. Additionally, funding for Jenni Rivera Park is being proposed using some of the

funds allocated in Year 3 of the Measure A plan for the MacArthur Park restroom that is no longer being recommended at this time. Additionally, \$145,000 of this surplus is needed to administer Measure A, which is partially funded from expenditure savings in this area in FY 17. Table 1 below shows the proposed uses for the Measure A surplus funds.

Lastly, as described at the October 10, 2017 Citizen's Advisory Committee meeting, per the City Council adopted Budget on September 5, 2017, if sufficient surplus exists in the Tidelands Operations Fund at year-end to fund the \$1.0 million contingent appropriation for the Convention Center improvements, \$1.0 million of Measure A funds that were planned for Convention Center improvements will be appropriated for replacement, repair and rapid response for sidewalks to be used Citywide based on need. Sufficient surplus in the Tidelands Operations Fund is available to fund these contingent appropriations and staff will adjust the budget accordingly.

Table 2 shows the original and revised FY 18 Measure A spending plan based on these changes.

The \$1,000,000 in Measure A Funds originally appropriated for Convention Center improvements will be reallocated as indicated in item "2" below.

^{2.} Contingent on the availability of FY 17 Year-End Tidelands Operations Fund surplus up to \$1,000,000, automatically reappropriate \$1,000,000 in Measure A Funds to be used for one-time purposes in the Public Works Department for Sidewalk Replacement, Repair, and Rapid Response to be used Citywide based on need.
