Five-Year Revenue Fleet Plan

## BACKGROUND

Long Beach Transit (LBT) is holding a Board of Directors' Study Session to educate its Board on the agency's five-year revenue fleet plan, as well as inform the Board on its zero-emission fleet plan process.

LBT operates a diverse fleet of 249 transit buses, including diesel, gasoline-electric hybrid, compressed natural gas (CNG) and battery-electric.

Gasoline-electric hybrid buses are no longer manufactured, thus leaving CNG and battery-electric technologies as LBT's bus fleet options.

To date, LBT has replaced 10 diesel buses with battery-electric buses (BEBs) and 27 diesel buses and 12 gasoline-electric hybrid buses with CNG buses.

LBT has an additional 89 buses eligible for replacement between 2019 and 2021.

Once LBT replaces 89 buses, all buses at LBT1 will be battery-electric. Beginning in 2024, CNG buses at LBT2 would be eligible for replacement.

Below is LBT's current fleet replacement plan:

LBT is planning to have a Request for Proposal (RFP) for BEB procurement within the first quarter of Calendar Year 2019.
