HONORABLE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL City of Long Beach California

RECOMMENDATION:

Adopt a Resolution authorizing the City Manager, or designee, to submit a grant application to the California Ocean Protection Council (OPC), for the Long Beach Municipal Urban Stormwater Treatment Recycle Facility; accept said grant, if awarded, in an amount up to \$2,000,000 in Proposition 1 funding through OPC grant funds; and, execute all documents necessary to accept the funds. (Districts 1, 7, 8, 9)

DISCUSSION

In November 2014, voters passed the Water Quality, Supply, and Infrastructure Improvement Act of 2014 (Prop 1), codified as Division 26.7 of the Water Code. Prop 1 authorizes \$7.5 billion in general obligation bonds for State water projects, including surface and groundwater storage, ecosystem and watershed protection and restoration, and drinking water protection. Prop 1 Chapter 6, "Protecting Rivers, Lakes, Streams, Coastal Waters, and Watersheds," allocated \$30 million to the California Ocean Protection Council (OPC) for a competitive grant program for multi-benefit ecosystem and watershed protection and restoration projects.

Prop 1 Ocean Protection Council (Prop 1 OPC) Round 3 is an open call for grant applications from January 28, 2019 through March 18, 2019, with \$10,000,000 available this round and a maximum award amount of \$2,000,000. OPC encourages applications for wetland and other habitat restoration projects, such as those typically funded through Prop 1, that provide a long-term benefit to the public and address at least one of the following priority issues: marine managed areas, ocean and coastal water quality impacts, fisheries and fish habitat, or climate change adaptation. The Long Beach Municipal Urban Stormwater Treatment (LB-MUST) project (Project) meets the guidelines of the Prop 1 OPC Round 3 grant program. City Council approval is requested to apply for \$2,000,000 in Prop 1 OPC grant funds. If awarded, the funds will be used to cover the funding shortfall associated with the additional scope of work and costs associated with the design and construction of the project.

This matter was reviewed by Amy R. Webber on February 14, 2019 and by Budget Analysis Officer Julissa José-Murray on February 25, 2019.

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TIMING CONSIDERATIONS

City Council action is requested on March 12, 2019, to ensure the grant application is submitted by the grant deadline. A Resolution authorizing submittal of the application is required in the application package.

FISCAL IMPACT

The total estimated project cost of the LB-MUST is \$32,000,000, which includes design, construction, construction management, inspection, labor compliance, and project oversight. The total cost is supported by \$28,000,000 from the California Department of Transportation grant funding, \$2,000,000 in grant funding from the Rivers and Mountains Conservancy, and \$428,000 from City Capital Projects funds.

No appropriation is requested at this time. Upon grant award, staff will return to the City Council with a request for appropriation, offset by grant revenue. The grant will have a dollar per dollar match requirement. Sufficient matching funds are currently appropriated in the Capital Projects Fund (CP) in the Public Works Department (PW) to meet the grant match requirements. Compiling of this report is expected to have minimal impact on staff hours and existing City Council priorities beyond the budgeted scope of duties. There is no local job impact associated with this recommendation.

RESOLUTION NO.

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LONG BEACH APPROVING THE APPLICATION FOR GRANT FUNDS FOR THE CALIFORNIA OCEAN PROTECTION COUNCIL'S PROPOSITION 1 GRANT PROGRAM UNDER THE WATER QUALITY, SUPPLY AND INFRASTRUCTURE IMPROVEMENT ACT OF 2014 (PROPOSITION 1), FOR THE LONG BEACH MUNICIPAL URBAN STORMWATER TREATMENT RECYCLE FACILITY

WHEREAS, the Legislature and Governor of the State of California have provided funds for the California Ocean Protection Council's Proposition 1 Grant Program; and

WHEREAS, the California Ocean Protection Council has been delegated the responsibility for the administration of this Program, establishing necessary procedures; and

WHEREAS, the City of Long Beach, as the applicant will enter into a contract with the State of California for the project;

NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Long Beach resolves as follows:

Section 1. Approves the filing of an application for the Long Beach Municipal Urban Stormwater Treatment (LB-MUST) Recycle Facility (the "Project") under the Water Quality, Supply and Infrastructure Improvement Act of 2014 (Proposition 1).

Section 2. Determines the City of Long Beach ("Applicant") Is eligible to apply for a State grant.

Section 3. Certifies that Applicant understands the assurances and certification in the application herein.

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Section 4. Certifies the City of Long Beach has long-term control of the property and will provide satisfactory documentation of the long-term control as part of the grant agreement development process.

Section 5. Certifies that Applicant will have sufficient funds to operate and maintain the Project consistent with the land tenure requirements; or will secure the resources to do so.

Section 6. Certifies the proposed Project is free of any legal challenges that could undermine progress on the Project.

Section 7. Gives State permission to publish any provided digital image to its website and to crop or resize the image.

Section 8. Agrees to acknowledge State's support in any news media, brochures, articles, publications, seminars, exhibits, buildings, displays, products, or other promotion materials about the funded Project.

Section 9. Certifies that it will comply with the provisions of Section 1771.5 of the State Labor Code regarding payment of prevailing wages on projects awarded Proposition 40 Funds.

Section 10. Agrees that projects involving construction, renovation, repair, rehabilitation, or ground or visual disturbances must comply with all current laws and regulations which apply to the Project, including, but not limited to, labor codes related to prevailing wage, legal requirements for construction contracts, building codes, environmental laws, health and safety codes, disabled access and historic preservation laws and environmental laws. Grantee will be required to certify that, prior to commencement of construction, all applicable permits and licenses (e.g., state contractor's license) will be obtained.

Section 11. Agrees to adhere to the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 (ADA) and the 2010 ADA Standards for Accessible Design. Title III of the ADA covers places of public accommodation (such as museums, libraries, and educational institutions) and includes a specific section regarding new construction and alterations in

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public accommodations.

Section 12. Agrees that projects involving construction, reposition, repair, rehabilitation, or ground or visual disturbances must comply with the National Historic Preservation Act and NAGPRA (Native American Graves Protection and Repatriation Act).

Section 13. Waives all rights to privacy and confidentiality of the material submitted to State.

Section 14. Agrees to execute a grant agreement prior to the encumbrance deadline, and will cause work on the Project to be commenced within a reasonable time after encumbering the funds, so that the Project will be complete and the final invoice submitted to the State by relevant deadlines.

Section 15. Agrees that for all property acquired with Prop 1 funds, Applicant will accept, sign, notarize and record a declaration of covenants, conditions and restrictions (deed restrictions) which attaches the conditions of the grant, as set forth in the grant agreement, on the use and enjoyment of the property until the end land tenure date specified in the grant agreement.

Section 16. Appoints the City Manager, or designee, as agent to conduct all negotiations, execute, and submit all documents including, but not limited to applications, agreements, payment requests and so on, which may be necessary for the completion of the Project.

Section 17. This resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption by the City Council, and the City Clerk shall certify the vote adopting this resolution.
