



Vector Benefit Assessment Overview

- Decided by all <u>property owners</u> in a mailed ballot proceeding, including business, apartment, and other property owners
- All returned ballots are counted
- Requires weighted majority of returned ballots
- Assessments are based on type of property, size, and dwelling units (this is not a flat-rate parcel tax)
- Most common local funding option for mosquito and vector control services, e.g. Fresno, San Diego, etc.




Vector Benefit Assessment Overview

In summary.....


If approved, this assessment would only apply to parcel owners in the areas serviced by the Long Beach Vector Control Program.

Parcel owners currently serviced by the Compton Creek or Greater Los Angeles County Vector Control District will not be affected.

Survey Objectives

- Evaluate <u>support</u>, <u>desires</u> and <u>priorities</u> of property owners regarding current and potential services provided by the City of Long Beach Vector Control Program
- Gauge the <u>level of support</u> for a local funding measure to maintain or improve year-round control of mosquitoes and vector-borne diseases



Scope of Work - Survey Methodology

- The survey tested 2 proposed annual rates, representing 2 service levels:
 - \$8.21 per single family home, with tiered rates for other types of property
 - \$14.92 per single family home, with tiered rates for other types of property
- Survey mailed to about 20,000 property owners using randomized, stratified samples
- 2,974 respondents = 15% return rate and margin of error of ± 1.75%
- Results include all types of property owners, and are adjusted to reflect weighted ballot features of a benefit assessment



Overall Support by Rate - Single Family Homeowners Only






Overall Support by Property Type

Property Type	Percent of Vote	Weighted Support
Single Family Residential	47.2%	65.1%
Apartment and Investment Property	37.7%	38.7%
Business and Industrial	9.0%	44.8%
Large Property Owners	5.8%	39.6%
Agricultural and Other	0.2%	34.5%
Total	100.0%	52.3%




Overall Property Owner Support






Overall Property Owner Support by Years in Residence

Service Priorities – Most Popular Projects

•	This measure will help control the emergence of invasive species, such as Aedes aegypti (Yellow Fever Mosquito), that can carry life-threatening diseases	67.6%
•	This measure will help prevent future outbreaks of Zika, Dengue, West Nile Virus and other diseases	66.9%
•	This measure will reduce mosquito Populations using environmentally- sound methods	.65.9%



Summary of Findings

 Property owners within the City Vector Control Program area support a measure to continue both providing control of mosquitoes and other pests, and monitoring and responding to public health issues.

Priorities are:

- 1. Controlling the emergence of <u>invasive species</u> that can carry lifethreatening diseases
- 2. Preventing <u>future outbreaks</u> of Zika, Dengue, West Nile virus and other diseases
- 3. Reducing mosquito populations using environmentally-sound methods
- 4. <u>Fiscal responsibility</u> proceeds used for mosquito and vector control services (not to be taken by the State or County)



Recommendations

 The City should <u>conduct a mailed ballot proceeding</u> to establish dedicated funding to provide comprehensive mosquito and vector control services <u>at the rate of \$8.21</u> per Single Family Residence per year
