Staff was gratified to see the smiles on so many young faces, many of whom may have visited the beach for the first time. These youth and volunteers represent every district, community and neighborhood in Long Beach.

The day was enhanced by the LA Kings who donated funds for the Dominos Pizza lunch, and also gave away rally towels and sunglasses. The Long Beach Airport donated boney hats and the Long Beach Water Department donated sunglasses. Staff also thanks Partners of Park for managing financial donations that paid for sports equipment, drinking water and ice.

Thanks to Field Permits Supervisor Gabe Cruz for leading this amazing effort with the CRS Recreation Assistants and Supervisors. Also making the day a success were the Marine Maintenance staff for handling the restrooms and trash, Beach Maintenance for creating the sand berms and sand raking, and involvement from Facilities Maintenance, Long Beach Fire Department, Long Beach Lifeguards, and Belmont Pool staff.

## New Playground Opens at M.L. King Jr. Park



A grand opening ceremony was held for the new playground at Martin Luther King, Jr. Park on August 7.

The new project included beautification and revitalization of the playground area and the installation of new and improved playground facilities with enhanced safety elements including rubberized landings. There is a separate tot lot with swings for younger children. Additional features were also included to ensure ADA accessibility and compliance.

The project was made possible by grant funding in the amount of \$315,754, from the California Department of Housing and Community Development and a Healthy Play Initiative Grant from the California Parks and Recreation Society (CPRS) that reduced the cost of the playground equipment.

Participants in PRM youth t-ball, baseball and softball leagues and their families came out for the annual Dodger Day at Heartwell Park on August 10 and enjoyed games, skills clinics put on by former Dodger players, Dodger alums signing autographs, and community information, health services and food booths.

For the third year in a row, PRM has participated in the Los Angeles Dodgers Foundation's (LADF) RBI (Reviving Baseball in Inner Cities) program that has a goal of increasing participation in baseball and increasing access to literacy, health, wellness, and recreational resources in underserved communities.

For the 2019 summer season, LADF awarded PRM \$6,076 in funding along with in-kind contributions of uniforms, equipment, recruitment flyers, location banners, educational and health resources, coach training, youth clinics, incentives and giveaways, and Dodger tickets to support up to 816 softball and baseball players. The grant funding will once again provide for park field maintenance costs and umpire fees in support of PRM's Youth Sport Program.

This summer there were 43 teams in the T-Ball/Coach Pitch Division with 516 kids, nine baseball teams with 110 kids and four softball teams with 50 players.



### **POW! WOW! Long Beach Murals Make an Impact**

POW! WOW! Long Beach is a week-long summer event held in locations throughout the City. It is part of the global POW! WOW! that has taken place in Tokyo Taipei, Honolulu, Washington D.C. and Seoul since 2010.

The name POW! WOW! comes from the comics where readers can see POW! when a super hero punches a villian in the face and WOW! being the reaction when people view the colorful murals. The term POW! WOW! also describes a gathering to celebrate culture and art. POW! WOW!'s mission to educate and bring Long Beach residents together though the impact of art, beautify the City and foster civic pride. Since 2017 a total of 40 murals have been painted throughout Long Beach.



## **Three New Members Inducted Into Long Beach Golf Hall of Fame**

The Long Beach Golf Hall of Fame, created in 1996 to recognize those individuals who "left their mark on Golf in Long Beach," will be welcomed three new members in 2019: Gary Albin, Jennifer Bermingham and David Solomon.



**Garry Albin**: "Marine One" as he is called (he served as the United States Marine Corp. pilot for Jimmy Carter and Ronald Reagan), is a Long Beach resident who joined the Southern California Golf Association (SCGA) Rules Committee in 2004 and the Southern California PGA Rules Committee a few years later. He has worked as the Head

Rules Official for over 100 Long Beach Golf Festival events and volunteers for at least 100 days per year for the SCGA, Southern California Professional Golf Association (SCPGA) and Long Beach Golf Festival as an official or to mark golf courses. He has offered educational clinics on the rules of golf for local men's and women's clubs as well as for junior and college golfers. His efforts have led to the proper playing of the game and excellent tournament experiences for thousands of southern California golfers.



Jennifer Bermingham:

Jennifer was born in Long Beach, prepped at Millikan High School and attended UC Riverside (UCR) where she was the 2006 Big West Freshman of the Year and named to the All-Big West Team every year. She also won the 2008 California Women's Championship and 2009 Long Beach Women's City Championship.

After UCR, she earned her Ladies Professional Golf Association (LPGA) Class A and Professional Golf Association (PGA) of America Class A teaching status. She was a popular instructor at Skylinks Golf Course for eight years and created the local LPGA-USGA (United States Professional Golf Association) Girls Golf of Long Beach Chapter in 2013. She made the cut in the KPMG Ladies PGA Championship and has served on multiple LPGA, USGA and PGA Committees promoting the game. She took a position at Coto de Caza Golf and Racquet Club in 2018.

**David Solomon**: David grew up playing Long Beach municipal golf courses and was captain of the teams at Wilson High School and Long Beach State. He worked at Skylinks and El Dorado Golf Courses and won the Club Championship at each course. David was the first person to win both the Long Beach City Match Play and Long Beach Stroke Play Championships. He was a teaching professional in the Northern California PGA Section at the Ruby Hill Country Club for six years



and was Head Golf Professional at the Napa Valley Country Club. David serves on the Northern California Section's (NCPGA) Tournament Committee and has finished among the Section's Top 5 point winners in four

different years, playing in multiple PGA National Club Professional and Assistant Professional Championships. He was the NCPGA Player of the Year in 2017, which earned him a spot in the 2018 Pebble Beach National Pro Am.

The Long Beach Golf Hall of Fame Induction Ceremony followed the conclusion of the \$175,000 Long Beach Open professional golf tournament at El Dorado Park Golf Course on August 11.
