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A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LONG BEACH ESTABLISHING A HISTORIC RESOURCES DESIGNATION FOR THE MINER SMITH BUNGALOW MANSION (1920) LOCATED AT 262 NEWPORT AVENUE, AS PRESCRIBED BY CHAPTER 2.63 THE LONG BEACH MUNICIPAL CODE TO OF BE RECORDED PURSUANT TO THE AUTHORITY OF GOVERNMENT CODE SECTION 27288.2 AND PUBLIC **RESOURCES CODE SECTION 5029**

RESOLUTION NO.

The City Council of the City of Long Beach does hereby resolve as follows: This Resolution is adopted pursuant to the authority and Section 1. mandate of California Public Resources Code Section 5029 in order to provide recorded notice to current and future owners of the affected properties that such properties have been designated as historical landmarks.

Section 2. Pursuant to Chapter 2.63 of the Long Beach Municipal Code, 18 19 the City Council of the City of Long Beach has adopted Ordinance No. 20 designating the Miner Smith Bungalow Mansion (1920) located at 262 Newport Avenue 21 as a local historical landmark. As a local historic landmark, the demolition, alteration, or 22 relocation is restricted, subject to controls and standards set forth in this resolution and in 23 Chapter 2.63 of the Long Beach Municipal Code, as may be amended from time to time. 24 The legal description for the Miner Smith Bungalow Mansion Section 3. 25 (1920) located at 262 Newport Avenue is set forth on Exhibit "A", attached hereto and 26 incorporated herein as though set forth in full. The owners of the Miner Smith Bungalow

Mansion (1920) are John Anthony Denissen and Steven Allen Murdock.

Section 4. Designation as a Historic Landmark. Pursuant to the

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1 provisions of Chapter 2.63 of the Long Beach Municipal Code and upon the 2 recommendation of the Cultural Heritage Commission, the City Council of the City of 3 Long Beach hereby designates the Miner Smith Bungalow Mansion (1920) located at 262 Newport Avenue as a local historic landmark based on satisfying significance criteria "C", 4 5 as defined in the City's Cultural Heritage Commission Ordinance (Long Beach Municipal 6 Code, Section 2.63.050). The designation of the Miner Smith Bungalow Mansion (1920) 7 as a local historic landmark has been codified in Section 16.52.2390 of the Long Beach 8 Municipal Code.

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A. <u>Basis for Recommendation</u>:

1. <u>Property Description</u>: The Miner Smith Bungalow Mansion (1920) is a Craftsman Bungalow style single-family residence built in 1920 by Miner Smith, an artisan builder in Long Beach. This building is uniquely important as Miner Smith's earliest known commission to build a house in Long Beach. This commission initiated the start of several "Bungalow Mansion" buildings he constructed mostly in the Belmont Heights neighborhood. Miner Smith's signature architectural features are visible in this building including planter niches in the porch piers, stone tree trunk rails at the porch and a wainscot stone detailing.

2. <u>Significance</u>: This building was designed and built by Miner Smith who was a local artisan builder in Long Beach and reflects the distinctive craftsmanship and artistic detailing unique to Miner Smith.

B. Rational for historic landmark designation:

The City Council finds that relative to the designation of the Miner Smith Bungalow Mansion (1920) located at 262 Newport Avenue as a local historic landmark, the following criteria are manifested as set forth in the Long Beach Municipal Code Section 2.63.050 based upon the following:

"C" <u>It embodies the distinctive characteristics of a type, period or</u> method of construction, or it represents the work of a master or it possesses

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high artistic values.

The structure reflects the distinctive craftmanship and artistic detailing unique to Miner Smith. While Miner Smith went on to build homes in other areas in Southern California, the homes he built in Long Beach are unique to Long Beach and built during a period of growth and expansion in the City. This structure is unique as the earliest known commission of Miner Smith to build a house in Long Beach.

Section 5. General guidelines and standards for any changes.

A. Any maintenance, repair, stabilization, rehabilitation, restoration, preservation, conservation, or reconstruction work proposed for the building shall be conducted in a manner consistent with the "Secretary of the Interior's Standards for the Treatment of Historic Properties with Guidelines for Preserving, Rehabilitating, Restoring, and Reconstructing Historic Buildings" (1995), by Weeks and Grimmer, as amended, as well as the "Procedures for Certificate of Appropriateness" (the "Standards") found in Section 2.63.080 of the Long Beach Municipal Code.

 B. The Standards are incorporated herein by this reference and shall be used as the authoritative guidelines for reviewing and approving any proposed exterior work on the building.

C. The provisions of this Resolution shall regulate the building's exterior walls and other external features. There shall be no restrictions on the building's interior.

D. Original historic fabric on the exterior of the building shall be executed in a matter that does not materially impair in an adverse manner those physical characteristics of the structure that account for its designation as a City landmark. Any such work must be done in keeping with the building's historic character, period, and architectural style.

1 E. No exterior changes to the building shall be allowed unless an 2 approved Certificate of Appropriateness has been applied for by an 3 applicant and is issued by the City authorizing such environmental change. 4 Pursuant to the authority of the Public Resources Code Section 6. 5 Section 5029 and Government Code Section 27288.2, the City Clerk shall cause a 6 certified copy of this Resolution to be recorded in the Official Records of the County of 7 Los Angeles. 8 Section 7. This Resolution shall take effect on the same date the 9 ordinance referred to in Section 2 of this Resolution becomes effective, and the City Clerk 10 shall certify the vote adopting this Resolution. 11 I hereby certify that the foregoing resolution was adopted by the City
