Situation

- Influx of unaccompanied migrant children arriving at US Southwest border
- Federal Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) seeking a sites to alleviate overcrowding
- Temporary intake sites house children while HHS reunites children with family members or sponsors
- Intake sites provide a safe, welcoming and nourishing experience for youth



Framework

- The City of Long Beach was requested by HHS to consider housing an Emergency Intake Site
- City Team considered alternate sites and determined the LB Convention Center (LBCC) the optimal location for this purpose
- The LBCC (operator SMG) contracts with HHS for housing and other LBCC-provided support services
- HHS to contract for child-care and all other service needs
- City provides support and connection to non-profit organizations, other government agencies, and private businesses for services



Considerations

- No impact to the ongoing vaccine operation from the Intake Center
- No impact to LBCC fall business commitments
- HHS is responsible for all costs associated with Intake Center operation
- HHS to cover all City costs for coordination and support to Intake Center
- Impacts to LBCC facilities to be covered by HHS (good or better condition)



Timeline & Next Steps

- Temporary site for up to 120 days
- Negotiate contract
- Authorize HHS to begin set up



Request approval to:

Negotiate with the federal government to establish a temporary site to house unaccompanied migrant children, and

Exempt the temporary site from provisions of the Long Beach Values Act and related administrative regulations
