

SUSTAINABILITY COMMITTEE EFFORTS

- Through regular meetings, the Sustainability Committee advises and supports Airport staff on the Mayor and City Council's goal for LGB to become a sustainability leader among airports.
- Thanks to a suggestion from the Sustainability Committee, Long Beach Airport entered into a
 partnership with the Good Traveler Program. The Good Traveler Program was founded by San Diego
 International Airport and is currently managed by Jet-Set Offset. This program provides travelers with
 the ability to voluntarily offset the environmental impact of their travel through the purchase of
 carbon offsets.
- The Sustainability Committee supports new efforts by Airport staff to collect sustainability data to gain a better understanding of the Airport's carbon footprint. This sustainability data will be used to quantify LGB's emissions inventory in preparation for Level 2 of Airport Carbon Accreditation (ACA) in 2021. Some of the data will also be used as part of a free energy audit that will be conducted by the Southern California Regional Energy Network (SoCalREN).
- The Sustainability Committee commends the signing of a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with the South Coast Air Quality Management District (AQMD) in December 2019. Due to the need to reduce NOx emissions in the region, Long Beach Airport, along with four other airports in the South Coast Air Basin, entered into an MOU with South Coast AQMD. Through the implementation of this MOU, LGB is able to quantify the emissions reduction benefits at the Airport. In conjunction with the timing of the completion of the Ground Service Equipment (GSE) Chargers Improvement Project in February 2020, the airlines are incentivized more than ever to replace older ground support equipment with electric GSE.

IMPACT OF COVID-19

The onset of the COVID-19 pandemic resulted in the cancellation of the March 2020 meeting. With no meeting scheduled in April, Commission Meetings resumed telephonically on May 21, 2020, in accordance with health and safety protocols, as well as the Brown Act. In-person meetings will resume when health and safety conditions allow.

RECOMMENDATIONS

Your Airport Advisory Commission appreciates the opportunity to serve the citizens of Long Beach. The Airport is an integral part of the City. A key goal of the Airport is to provide business opportunities, air travel services and economic benefits while respecting the quality of life of our communities. The Airport Advisory Commission is a key link in this process. It is important that the Airport maintain its compatibility with the surrounding community. The Commission recognizes the ongoing benefits from its continuing involvement in fulfillment of its mission as prescribed by City Code. The Commission reviews air carrier and total noise budget data to ensure compliance with Long Beach Municipal Code Chapter 16.43 quarterly. This independent oversight provides the public with assurance that Airport staff is adhering to the environmental commitments made to the community. This dedication to providing timely reporting on noise violations and noise complaint data, as well as exploring opportunities to reduce adverse noise events, is important to the public. Their continued commitment to reviewing this information regularly with the Commission ensures compliance with the Noise Compatibility Ordinance and assurance that the Airport is taking its environmental obligations to the community seriously.

As it has in the past, the Commission will continue to interface with the Mayor, Council members and the community to share its views and what it has learned. We encourage your Honorable Mayor and City Council to rely on our resources of knowledge and inter-organizational contacts, including through the referral of issues.

The Commission looks forward to working with the City and its representatives over the coming year(s). We hope to continue to actively engage the public through our outreach efforts on issues such as:

- Desired achievements of the Airport's sustainability plan;
- Green airport matters, including noise abatement and land use compatibility; and
- Regional, state and federal affairs, as well as special events.
