FY 21-22 Annual Appropriations

Overview

- Appropriations panel approved multiple bills, subcommittees advancing more
- Committee will consider remaining bills this week, including
 Transportation-HUD:
 - \$107.2 billion for DOT, an increase of \$21.1 billion
- House Floor activity in July, bicameral funding deal by September 30th

Reauthorization: Highways and Transit

Overview

- Surface transportation programs under the FAST Act are set to expire September 30th
- Congress enacted a one-year extension after the last authorization expired in 2020
- Programs cover highways, transit, rail, safety, and research

Reauthorization: INVEST in America Act

Legislation


- \$715 billion surface transportation and water infrastructure
- 5-year reauthorization
- Includes Long Beach highways and transit infrastructure earmarks
 - Artesia Boulevard: \$8 million
 - Anaheim Street: \$12 million
 - ADA curbramps and sidewalks: \$1.45 million

Status


- Passed House on July 1st, 221-201
- Must still go through Senate




Reauthorization Funding Overview

Alignment


 We don't know how the various proposals will align with each other and the appropriations and House-passed reauthorization bills

- \$3.5 trillion deal announced yesterday
