Expenditure Status Update

- Mid-year adjustments include:
 - \$5.5 million add for projects funded from FY 20 surplus and carryover from previously approved projects
 - \$2.9 million adjustment, funded by transfer back from Measure A funds previously sent to CIP for Fire Station 9 land acquisition, rent and utilities for temporary Station 9 and Fire Engineer Academy support
- Measure B Stabilization Fund projection increased to \$684K to reflect revenue projection increase
- \$800,000 planned set-aside for ADA sidewalk and curb-ramp requirements



Revenues Status Update

- Measure Revenue budget of \$62.7 million was determined June 2020 at beginning of pandemic with limited data on its impact on revenue sources
- Revenues based on two quarters of activity covering October through March total \$32.8 million
- These revenues are showing a trend of better performance than budgeted
 - Increases in General Consumer Goods, Business and Industry and Autos and Transportation have offset losses in Restaurants and Hotels

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- More revenues than previous years from on-line sales activity and AB147
- Staff will continue to monitor and provide updates to City Council



- Measure A program continues to fund high priority needs and projects
- There was significant uncertainty in terms of how Measure A would be impacted by the pandemic at the time of budget development
- Current data is showing a positive performance and a trend towards the revenues performing better than budget
- Staff will continue monitor and provide updates to City Council in performance reports



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
