4	CITY OF LONG BEACH IN HONOR OF THE CITY OF LONG				
5	BEACH'S 24TH ANNUAL VETERANS DAY CELEBRATION

7	WHEREAS, veterans are an integral part of the Long Beach community; and				
8	WHEREAS, Long Beach is home to more than 16,000 veterans and more				
9	than 3,000 veteran-owned businesses; and				
10	WHEREAS, the local Veterans Administration system provides primary care				
11	to 50,000 veterans across Southern California; and				
12	WHEREAS, Long Beach honors veterans and their service each year during				
13	Veteran's Day celebrations, which includes the Veteran's Day Parade and the Veteran's				
14	Festival; and				
15	WHEREAS, as Long Beach recognizes the service these community				
16	members have made to this Country and this City, it is important to also recognize that the				
17	City owes support to its veterans; and				
18	WHEREAS, the City has taken steps to involve veterans in local government				
19	and create platforms to advocate for veterans priorities, including the creation of the				
20	Veterans Commission and development of a Veterans Affairs Strategic Plan; and				
21	WHEREAS, although the City has made strides on veteran's issues, there is				
22	still much more progress to be made. 175 of Long Beach veterans experienced				
23	homelessness, with 76 of them being unsheltered. A true commitment to honoring Long				
24	Beach's veterans will entail making sure that none of them go unhoused; and				
25	WHEREAS, Veteran's Day should be both a recognition of the				
26	accomplishments and sacrifices of Long Beach's veterans and a recognition of how much				
27	Long Beach still must do to fulfill its promises to its veteran community;				
28	NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Long Beach resolves as
