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	13	WHEREAS, on July 5, 2016, the City Council awarded a contract to
	14	Environmental Systems Research Institute, Inc. ("ESRI") for information technology
	15	products and services, including software licensing, maintenance and support; and
	16	WHEREAS, the City uses ESRI technologies to power geospatial needs
	17	throughout the City; and
	18	WHEREAS, Geographic Information Systems (GIS) data powers operations
	19	at nearly every City department, and is most notably used by Department of Development
	20	Services, Department of Energy Resources, Fire Department, Police Department, and
	21	Water Department; and
	22	WHEREAS, ESRI's product suite enables staff to conduct geospatial
	23	analysis, create maps, exchange spatial data with other applications, and provide open
	24	data; and
	25	WHEREAS, ESRI is currently contracted for the licensing, maintenance and
	26	support services for the City's GIS program; and
	27	WHEREAS, ESRI's software is a proprietary suite of applications that are
	28	developed, implemented, and supported solely by ESRI; and
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WHEREAS, because of the proprietary relationship between ESRI's product
 suite and the GIS program, no other alternative is possible without fully procuring two new
 systems, which would not be a responsible use of City time or resources. This request is
 the most cost-effective and efficient solution to allow for continued use of the product suite;
 and

6 WHEREAS, no useful purpose would be served by advertising for bids and 7 to do so would constitute an idle and useless act and an unnecessary expenditure of public 8 funds;

9 NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Long Beach resolves as 10 follows:

11 Section 1. The City Manager is hereby authorized to enter into a contract, 12 without advertising for bids, with Environmental Systems Research Institute, Inc. for 13 providing information technology products and services, as well as software licensing, 14 maintenance and support in a total annual contract amount not to exceed Three Hundred 15 Five Thousand Dollars (\$305,000), for a period of three (3) years. If the sole source status 16 of Environmental Systems Research Institute, Inc. changes, City shall publicly bid instead 17 of extending the contract.

Section 2. This resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption
by the City Council, and the City Clerk shall certify the vote adopting this resolution.

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
