



Re: Long Beach Redistricting – Public Comment November 3, 2021 Meeting

On last Wednesday evening (November 3, 2021), we watched the hearing proceedings regarding redistricting in Long Beach, CA.

We are working long hours and don't usually track emails. Unfortunately, the business regarding this important redistricting process is online (no mail was sent to our home regarding this); we now are addressing these important projects, which has implications for our area and us for the next 10 years.

In researching this process, we learned that redistricting also affects the number of seats in the House of Representatives for the 47th Congressional District. As we are reviewing all materials, as well as, looking at associated data, following are our thoughts:

- ❖ We believe that the proposed redistricting will have adverse affects for Bixby Knolls as Bixby Knolls will be split in half according to our Census Tracts (CT):
 - 1) Bixby Knolls North CT 5715.02
 - 2) Bixby Knolls South CT 5719
- ❖ We did not purchase this property in Bixby Knolls in 1999 to be separated from the rest of the Bixby Knolls area. In the updated map, we are no longer referred to as Bixby Knolls. We feel we in many ways will be cut in half. Imagine how you would feel this way as both north and south have a symbiotic relationship, which will be cut as we support businesses in the south but will no longer receive revenues for our district.
- ❖ We did not leave our city in 1999 to live in a city that is beginning to look like the communities we left. We do not want to live in an underserved community (and yes, not being connect to our Bixby Knolls South – Census Track 5719) that is what we fear we will become. We do not want to deal with the problems and issues residents have with no help from our local

- government. Nor do we want our local government to steal from us what we worked so hard to attain.
- Proposed Bixby Knolls South (Census Track 5719) is part of our business district for which we shop and go to restaurants. The taxes these businesses pay are used for Bixby Knolls and the needs of District 8. Without this income for District 8 (due to re-districting), our community will have less access to needed services, which include infrastructure and repaving our streets, which would adversely affect our community.
- We are also concerned with our property values being compromised, as well as, safety in our community.
- ❖ We believe that this redistricting is a form of redistribution of wealth (removing wealth from Bixby Knolls North) by placing our business district in Bixby Knolls South. This redistricting will have an adverse affect on the middle class in this area.

Lastly, when researching data from the 2020 Census, there is no data for redistricting in zip code 90807. Also North Long Beach received a community development Block Grant that did not benefit Bixby Knolls. Our neighbors have requested for or neighborhood streets to be re-paved, yet we have been ignored!

Again, we do not want to be separated from the rest of Bixby Knolls!!! It is not in our best interest!!!

That is how we are included in the 4th District now, and its clear that the representation is focused on Los Altos' problems rather than Bryant and Zaferia. We have much more in common with the neighborhoods to the west rather than east. I would like to be included in the district to the west.

Second, the commission seems to be moving in the direction of consolidating all of downtown into a single district. I think this is misguided for a number of reasons. It puts too much power in the hands of one council member, since most of the largest businesses, the port and city hall its self would all be included in one district. Along those lines, it would put too much work on one council member, since they would have so many powerful interests in their district. It also put most of the planned growth into one district, since most of the rest of the city is restricted to low-density housing.

I hope that you can improve the maps as they are currently written and that these suggestions are useful.





All:

I am writing to you on behalf of a concerned citizen of Long Beach to address the redistricting process the currently is ongoing in the City of Long Beach ("City"). Specifically, my client is concerned the Redistricting Commission admittedly is presenting and is supporting Redistricting maps improperly based on race and that are specifically drawn to benefit Roberto Uranga and other political interests. While I will set forth below an overview of the information we have learned or obtained thus far – and our investigation is continuing – we submit the City Attorneys' Office also must immediately investigate these concerns – which should begin with a review of the minutes of the November 3, 2021 Redistricting Meeting, which I understand Ms. Anderson attended, wherein the Chairwoman openly admitted all of the redistricting efforts have centered around an improper effort to keep "disenfranchised" Latino votes together in District G.

We believe your office also must investigate bias and undue influence over what is supposed to be an independent Redistricting Commission, as it is an open secret in the community that the Commission is controlled by, and is acting at the behest of, Rex Richardson and Roberto Uranga.

The basis for my client's present concerns can be summarized as follows:

The early proposed Redistricting maps show a much different, and frankly more reasonable and logical, set of boundaries for the various City Council districts. Then, in an effort to assuage concerns by Mr. Uranga about his political viability based on the boundaries contained in those earlier maps – including Map 1rc -- the Commission was pressured into significantly altering the proposed maps, and more specifically to substantially reconfigure District "G" – which would be

Uranga's district as reconfigured. That reconfiguration included the removal altogether of the northeast portion of the district, which Mr., Uranga did not believe he would fare well in, and to instead add a significant piece located west of the 710 freeway which originally had been included within proposed District "A" because it contained what the Commission believed to be a significant Latino population. At the November 3, 2021 Commission meeting, the Chairwoman admitted the reconfiguration of District G between Map 1rc and Map 1b was to keep the City's Latino population together in one district. Of course, that purpose violates the prohibition on making race a predominant factor in the redistricting calculation. See Exh. A. Further, as it is clear the entire mapping process vis-à-vis District "G" revolves around the residency and political protection of Mr. Uranga, and all other districts have been gerrymandered in an effort to support those improper priorities, it also violates the prohibition on the Commission considering the residence of anyone in the creation of the map, including incumbent or political candidates. Id.

The improper foundational intent of the Commission's work – to keep Latinos together and to politically benefit Mr. Uranga based on his residency – in turn has led to the blatant and illogical gerrymandering of virtually every other district, in violation of the requirement that the Commission make districts compact and that it not bypass nearby populations for further away populations. The Commission's violations of those requirements are readily apparent from even a cursory comparison of Maps 1rc and 1b, both of which are attached hereto. See Exh. B.

As you can see, for improper racial and political protection purposes, the Commission took the entire Western half of what is now proposed District G from District A, and also removed the entire Northeastern portion of the proposed District G and added it to District E – making District E a clearly gerrymandered and ill-configured district. That then spawned the need to gerrymander other districts, including adding the Northeastern section to District D that previously had been a (logical) part of District E (which, as set forth above, had to be gerrymandered in order to allow District E to accept the Northeastern portion which was removed from District G). To make "the math work," the Commission then was required to badly reconfigure Districts B and F into contorted and illogical geographical shapes, in violation of the requirement that districts be compact (the entirety of District B had been along the coast, yet now takes a "sharp left turn" northwards into territory previously part of District F, causing the need to substantially redraw District F into an equally strange geographical configuration).

Obviously, I cannot fully and properly lay out the entirety of my client's concerns in one concise letter, but I think you get the point (or should) of my client's justifiable concerns, particularly since the Chairwoman admitted on November 3rd that the entire point of Map 1b was to create a district (G) based on race, which created a "domino effect" need to gerrymander *all* of the other proposed districts – all to benefit Mr. Uranga politically. **To be clear**, this matter must be investigated by the City Attorneys' office and rectified immediately, and it must assure that any finally approved map inf act conforms to the legal and procedural requirements under which the Commission must operate, and not based on racial strategies or the political wills or desires of Messrs. Uranga and/or Richardson.

Please be advised that if this matter is not immediately investigated and then rectified to cure all of the illegal/improper things that are going on, if the Commission is not immediately shorn of undue political control and influence so that it can properly complete its task to draw districts that conform to the law and its own requirements, my client, likely among others, will have no choice but to initiate litigation designed to invalidate any final redistricting map and to require the Commission to start over while (this time) following applicable requirements, and not improper political and/or racial preferences.

As my father used to say, "you have now been warned, so please govern yourselves accordingly."




- Minimize Divisions of Neighborhoods and Communities

 Neighborhoods and communities sharing a common language, history, culture and identity should not be divided so as to dilute their voting power
- Geography / Topography Districts should respect major topographic and geographic features of the City
- **Understandable by Voters** Making districts that are sensible and can be easily understood by residents.
- **Compact** Making districts compact shapes and not bypassing nearby populations for far-away populations.
- Follow Census Blocks Using the census geography provided by the State of California to preserve the validity of data and avoid arbitrary boundaries
- Residence of Any Individual Cannot Be Considered. The Commission cannot consider the place of residence of any individual, including any incumbent or political candidate, in the creation of a map.







- Achieve districts of equal population


Based on the above, we recommend the following adjustments to Proposed Final Map (IRC Draft Map 2): (Please see images of maps provided below)

- 1. At E. Ocean Blvd., move the western border of District C to Junipero Avenue
- 2. At E. 4th St., move the western border of District C to Redondo Avenue
- 3. At E. 10th St., move the western border of District C to Ximeno Avenue
- 4. At E. Anaheim St., move the western border of District C to Termino Avenue
- 5. Between E. 7th St. and E. 10th St., move the eastern border of District B to Cherry Avenue

Together we took careful consideration not to disrupt the boundaries of the western boarder of proposed District B.

The Bluff Heights Neighborhood Association's Board would like to extend our appreciation for your efforts on behalf of the City's redistricting process.

Over these many weeks, Bluff Heights has worked closely and collaboratively with the leadership of Bluff Park, Belmont Shore, Alamitos Heights, Belmont Heights and Carroll Park. In fact, this collaboration reflects decades of collaboration with our other historic and coastal area communities and is evidence that we should, indeed, stay whole and together as we have continued to support our communities of interest.

It is extremely important that you are aware that another map (Map # 77344) and letter submitted to you on November 7 is disputed by the Board of Bluff Heights. In this letter, the author inaccurately stated that Bluff Heights agrees with, "one option would be to bring the Broadway district line to a more natural border at 3rd street and equally divide the Bluff Heights Neighborhood to North (Area B and South Area C), creating one representative for each area that is not divided by a business corridor. 




Proposed District C Boundaries (illustrated by Map 76918 as a suggested adjustment to IRC Draft Map 2):



Informational outline of historic districts and organized communities:














Informational outline of historic districts and organized communities:





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



Please accept my support for Map 2.2 and for a collective city-wide effort to create a map that ensures Communities of interests have a voice. Organizations such as the creators of the Equity Map, Centro Cha, the Cambodian Community, and the Black Ministers Alliance have been organizing to create a map that protects Black neighborhoods, keeps the Cambodian Community together, and solidifies a Latino Cultural district that includes a library and the Museum of Latin America Art, while ensuring the eastern side of the city has a voice and economic engines like the Airport, the Port, and Downtown have multiple representatives.

With this redistricting recommendation, Downtown, residents, businesses and the Port of LB will have representation and accountability, and in Central Long Beach, historic black communities are protected, while unifying the Cambodian community and increasing representation for the Latino community.

In East Long Beach, the Map ensures neighborhoods are maintained, including Rancho Estates, and increases representation for the Airport to two councilmembers, while creating a district of shared interests from Bixby to Rancho Estates.

In North Long Beach, this map includes 2 council offices to ensure the region historically left behind has representation to support economic development and community preservation. On the Westside, the map keeps the neighborhoods of Wrigley and West Long Beach as communities of interest and does not dilute the majority minority votes.

Say Goodbye to the 5th District If You Live in the Ranchos, Plaza, Eldorado Park Estates, Imperial Estates, El Dorado Park South: GerrieMandering at Its Finest

Say goodbye to the 5th Council District if you live north of Spring and east of Studebaker. The City Independent Redistricting Commission is about to publish a map that cuts up the 5th (also referred to as E) and combines the upper part with Bixby Knolls and Cal Heights and the other parts are put into the 4th Council District along with all of El Dorado Park.

How did this happen? In November 2018, Long Beach voters approved Measure DDD, which amended the City Charter to create a commission, comprised of residents, responsible for determining the boundaries of council districts every 10 years after the national Census. The commissioners were appointed by the Mayor and City Council.

The Mayor and City Council touted this proposal to establish a redistricting commission by telling voters that it would be "independent." In the past, the City Council actually conducted the redistricting process and, on several occasions, drew council boundaries to fit the political needs of the incumbents or political opponents. The strangest of all drawings, pulled the Nature Center from the 5th District to give it to the 4th so that the 4th district incumbent had more park area.

The current process is far from independent. When a current incumbent packed a commission meeting to protest her residence being removed from her council district, the commission changed its proposed map and put her back in. The City Charter mandates: "The Commission shall not consider place of residence of any individual, including any incumbent or political candidate, in the creation of a map."

When several others argued that the Long Beach Airport needed to be divided among several districts, it was. Consequently, the Commission released a map that divides the 5th District north of Spring and combines it with Bixby Knolls and Cal Heights. The remainder of the district: Ranchos, Plaza, El Dorado Park Estates, Imperial Estates and El Dorado Park South are placed in the 4th District along with all of El Dorado Park.

Quick disclaimer here: this map removes the incumbent Stacy Mungo and the two announced candidates for the 2022 election: Michelle Dobson and Gerrie Schipske.

This map likely violates the City Charter that mandates: "The Commission shall number each Council district such that, for as many residents as possible, the number of the Council district they reside in remains the same." The majority of the 5th District is being placed in the 4th District.

Redistricting is supposed to reflect the concept of "one person one vote" which requires council boundaries to adequately reflect the composition of an area so that residents who have a "community of interest" are kept in the same districts. The districts are to essentially contain the same number of residents in each.

Where do these commissioners get their "expertise" to draw council boundaries? From a paid consultant hired by the City Manager. Who does the City Manager report to? The Mayor and City Council. Who "staffs" the commission meetings? A member of the City Manager's department. Who directs the City Manager's staff? The City Manager. Who hires the City Manager? The Mayor and City Council.

The current redistricting process is hardly independent. The Commission is publishing its semifinal map November 10 and will then vote to finalize it on November 18.

As of last week, only one map had been selected to move forward for consideration. **IRC Draft Map 1** was popular with those in attendance at the last two meetings and it retained the current boundaries of the 5th district.

In spite of the Commission working on Map 1 to the wee hours of the morning 10/27/21, IRC Draft Map 1 late in the evening 11/3/21 was summarily dismissed with a vote where 4 commissioners voted against moving it forward. As it turns out, the rules require that 9 votes must be in favor to move a map forward and the vote was 8-4 in favor of that map. Most of the audience had spoken in favor of this map. *The minority overrode the majority* which hits my democracy funny bone. It doesn't sit right with me.

The 5th district *till now* enjoyed remaining largely in the same configuration and boundaries as we have in place today. Consequently, there was no 5th district COI (community of interest), speaking on behalf of retaining the current district borders as it didn't seem to be threatened. That is no longer the case. Tonight is the only night left to speak out if you desire an outcome that retains the existing natural boundaries of the 5th. If you cannot attend, and wish to weigh in on this, you can send an email to the commission (address at bottom of this email).

A new map IRC1b did get approved to move forward with a 9-3 vote very late in the meeting on Nov 3rd. https://www.longbeach.gov/common/redistrictingHTMLFiles/Draft_Map_2.html See district E (highlighted in purple)

District 5 is unrecognizable in this new map, with a portion of the north side of today's district 5 combined with several neighborhoods on the westside (Cal Heights, Los Cerritos, and the south end of Bixby Knolls). The Commission worked for over an hour trying to balance out the numbers in each district. Their initial intent was to resolve problems that occurred 10 years ago that split Wrigley and Bixby Knolls neighborhoods in what was described as a move to gerrymander the 7th and 8th districts. As the commission worked to remedy the split neighborhoods that occurred in the past, balancing the numbers in each district while retaining neighborhood continuity proved to be difficult. The end result is an odd marriage of east and west that disrespects the natural boundaries of the eastside, mainly the 5th district. An unintended consequence of this map (happy accident) is that it does offer representation for the main westside communities negatively impacted by the airport by combining them into the 5th. Also, the 4th district has a piece of airport property on Lakewood and Spring street that covers the landing portion of the runway. What could become the new 5th district has the rest of the airport. In all, that would result in 2 districts having a piece of the airport which definitely benefits those impacted by landing and takeoff noise (see noise map attached).

If all of this sounds like jibberish, I suggest you paste the links into your browser and take a look at the maps.

Creating a commission of citizens was supposed to remove the political influence that creates gerrymandered districts. News articles on this topic will tell you that redistricting is all about elections and a carefully placed borderline can have major impact on the outcome of an election. As we round the corner to the deadline, many political operatives are attempting to influence the outcome to further their political ambitions. In the current version of the only map that moved forward (draft map IRC1b), Stacy Mungo, current the council member for the 5th will have her home in the 4th and be unable to run for a 3rd term in district 5 unless she uproots her family and moves within the boundaries of the new 5th. Challenger and former councilwoman Gerrie Schipske will also reside in the 4th district and be unable to run in the upcoming election if this map is approved. Councilwoman Cindy Allen, 2nd district will also no longer reside in that district and would need to move to run for a 2nd term if draft map IRC1b is selected and

approved. Redistricting is not supposed to take into account where political operatives live, so that is not the problem. However a map that does not follow the guidelines of creating districts that are contiguous (connected) and respectful of natural boundaries which keeps neighborhoods that are homogenous connected will not make much sense to those arbitrarily thrown together with the only justification being that it evens the numbers out.

The real enemy of this process is time - time to get it right. The first week of December is the deadline to complete the process if we wish to submit the new districts to the state in time for the next election cycle. We could delay completion till March of 2022 and go forward using existing districts for the next election. Rae Gabelich, former councilwoman for the 8th district has been pleading with the commission to take the time to get it right. There is no indication they are listening.

Forewarned is forearmed. If you don't like what you see in these maps, do something about it.



At the behest of concerned residents residing in California Heights, the Board of the California Heights Neighborhood Association met to discuss the various proposals presented to, and created by, the Independent Redistricting Commission (Commission).

With a unanimous and enthusiastic voice, we support keeping California Heights whole and adjoined with Bixby Knolls, as recommended by the proposed **Final Map (IRC Draft Map 2)** and **IRC Draft Map 1 (Amended 10.27.21)**.

We believe that these maps meet the redistricting requirements set forth in the City Charter, as it pertains to the following:

Section 2506 (b) (1) – Geographic Integrity

California Heights is an official City Historic District, with defined boundaries along Atlantic Avenue, Bixby Road, Cherry Avenue, and Wardlow Road. These two maps preserve the historic district/neighborhood in its entirety, as has been the practice with other Council District maps over the last 50 years.

Section 2506 (b) (2) – Communities of Interest

As mentioned by Board President Hugh Little in separate correspondence, California Heights and Bixby Knolls share a strong relationship. The residents in each neighborhood shop together, worship together, and volunteer together. In fact, California Heights volunteers have been tasked with watering the trees located in the medians and parkways of the Bixby Knolls Business District. Adjoining California Heights with Bixby Knolls acknowledges the contiguous population that shares common social and economic interests.



Section 2506 (b) (3) – Shared History

The City's own development history links the California Heights Historic District with the Bixby Knolls area east of Atlantic Avenue, between Bixby Road and San Antonio Drive. In 1929, when the last California Heights subdivision was laid out, the Bixby family "announced plans for a 120-acre residential area east of Atlantic Avenue and between Bixby Road and San Antonio Drive," converting a lima bean field into what would become Bixby Knolls. The Deeble-Chapman Corporation, a prominent Southern California real estate development firm, was the developer of note for both this new Bixby Knolls development and what was then known as 'California Heights Terrace.'

Due to California Height's defined historic boundaries, its strong social and economic relationship with Bixby Knolls, as well as its shared development history with the original Bixby Knolls neighborhood, we urge you to keep California Heights whole and adjoin it with Bixby Knolls as identified in **Final Map (IRC Draft Map 2)** and **IRC Draft Map 1 (Amended 10.27.21)**.

As an independent group of board members and residents from the above noted communities, we would like to thank the Commission and Staff for your continued efforts on the difficult task to redistrict our city.

Just as we have asked for you to hear our community comments in support of IRC Draft Map 1- Amended 10.27.21 with regards to area C, we have also <u>heard you</u>, the Commission, in your decision to not advance that map. In the spirit of compromise, we have worked together to thoughtfully review the map that was advanced (**Proposed Final Map (IRC Draft Map 2)** and how it could support the concept of "Whole and Together" - keeping our neighborhoods 'whole' and our inter-coastal communities of interest 'together'.

Our review focused specifically on the 'Requirements and Criteria' of the commission in the City Charter which include:

- Minimize Divisions of Neighborhoods and communities sharing a common language, history, culture and identity
- Keep each district a whole, contiguous unit with clearly defined boundaries
- Achieve districts of equal population

Based on the above, we recommend the following adjustments to Proposed Final Map (IRC Draft Map 2):

- 1. Between E. Ocean Blvd. and E. 4th St., move the western border of District C to Junipero Ave.
- 2. Between E. 4th St. and E. 10th St., move the western border of District C to Redondo Ave.
- 3. Between E. 10th St. and E. Anaheim St., move the western border of District C to Ximeno Ave.
- 4. Between E. Anaheim St. and Pacific Coast Highway, move the western border of District C to Termino Ave.
- 5. Between E. 7th St. and E. 10th St., move the eastern border of District B to Cherry Ave.

These suggested amendments (illustrated by map 76918, available for Commission and Staff review) have the following positive impacts that align with the aforementioned "Requirements and Criteria":

- Respects the west and northern district updates made by the Commission on November 3rd, with no changes to districts D, E, F, G, H, and I
- According to our calculation, creates an overall maximum population deviation of 4.85%
- Keeps the inter-coastal communities together
- Brings the coastal historic districts together
- Equalizes the district population size for Districts A, B and C
- Corrects the division of some neighborhoods previously not made whole (Rose Park and Bluff Park) in Proposed Final Map (IRC Draft Map 2). As a side note, we have observed a few discrepancies between the actual neighborhood borders and those noted in some Commission maps. An example is Bluff Park which ends at Loma Avenue but has been depicted to end at Redondo Avenue.

In closing, these amendments to Proposed Final Map (IRC Draft Map 2) support the concept of 'Whole and Together' for Communities of Interest originally outlined in Draft Map 1- Amended 10.27.21 related to District C. They also represent our efforts to understand and compromise with the direction the Commission has taken with Proposed Final Map (IRC Draft Map 2). This effort exemplifies how these communities collaborate and why we desire to remain 'Whole and Together'.








Informational outline of historic districts and organized communities:




Proposed Map for all Districts (illustrated by Map 76918 as a suggested adjustment to IRC Draft Map 2):

I kindly request that you retain/accept MAP 1 as amended on October 27, 2021 (https://www.longbeach.gov/globalassets/redistricting/media-library/documents/irc-draft-map-1---amended-10-27-21) for these reasons:

Honorable Commission Members,

The California Heights Neighborhood Association would like to bring to your attention our concerns regarding the way several of the maps under current consideration have been formed. We would like the opportunity to share our perspective regarding the relationship between our neighborhood and our adjacent and surrounding neighborhoods in Bixby Knolls and Wrigley.

It was at last week's meeting when I first encountered the notion of California Heights not being an integral part of Bixby Knolls. I knew that we were a distinct *neighborhood* of our own, but honestly, I had always thought we were considered part of Bixby Knolls, rather than a separate entity to the immediate South. Our Northern border is Bixby Knolls' Southern border, but our economic and political relationships extend North along Atlantic at least as far as San Antonio or Del Amo. Correspondingly, I do not believe the Bixby Knolls Business Improvement Association ceases operation South of Bixby on Atlantic – to the contrary, the residents of California Heights would be delighted to have the businesses along the Wardlow corridor be able to participate in the development that we have all been delighted to see up Atlantic.

Currently situated in the Seventh district, within walking distance of the Eighth district, California Heights has benefited from knowing that at least two council members will understand, if not share, our positions on issues that affect our neighborhood. Our traffic, our impacts from the airport, even our economic goals are all woven into what I call the 'Greater' Bixby Knolls area.

I would, on behalf of the residents of California Heights, like to ask you to please consider this relationship when reviewing, approving, or making edits to current or potential future redistricting maps. I think I speak for all of us when I say that California Heights does not particularly care which district we wind up in – but we very strongly feel that it should be the same district as the rest of Bixby Knolls, rather than as a pseudopod of the current Fifth District, connecting us arbitrarily to the East side of the Long Beach Airport. The Airport is itself a pretty natural dividing line for much of the city, but our neighborhood has much more in common economically and politically with our neighbors to the West of Cherry than we do with our more distant neighbors to the East of Lakewood Boulevard.

As a resident of district 5, I oppose Map 2, the map elevated for consideration as a final map last week. The map sacrifices the communities in district 5, breaking them apart for no better reason than to deal with the population numbers that resulted from trying to put Wrigley back together. Having a district that goes from the LA River to El Dorado Park does not serve the public interest.

As a member of the Airport Adjacent Neighborhoods Group (AANG), I acknowledge that map 2 does allow for the neighborhoods west of the airport to have a council member that has a portion of the airport in their district. However, map 1, with the amendment proposed last week that gives a portion of the airport to the district on the westside, accomplishes the same thing without breaking up the 5th district.

I support the original map 1 and ask that it be reconsidered/amended and made available as a candidate for the final map. That map is well balanced with natural boundaries and contains many asks and changes that came from the community. The majority of the people that provided maps for your consideration had similar boundaries to what exist today in district 5. Public input should matter.

SCHOOLS-

Map 2: In pulling apart the 5th district, you have moved Milliken H.S. into district D (the 4th) and split the students between the D (4th) and E (5th).

Map 2: Cubberley Elementary is in District E (5th) with students split between districts E (the 5th) and district D (the 4th).

CONTIGUOUS BOUNDARIES:

Map 2: The criteria for natural contiguous boundaries has been violated. The neighborhoods are divided by a significant barrier - the airport. The airport cuts the city into east and west. East and west populations have very different issues.

Map 2: The neighborhoods surrounding El Dorado Park all have connection to that property but it has been moved to the 4th with just a few neighborhoods. Map 2 cuts out the entire neighborhood north of Wardlow (Carson Park) that is directly adjacent to and affected by El Dorado Park and puts it in district E while the park is in District D.

EQUITY:

Map 2 does nothing meaningful towards equity.

GERRYMANDERING?

Good evening,

I am Dr. La Vonne Hamilton. My husband and I are homeowners in Bixby Knolls. We attended the November 3, 2021 meeting online and sent our response to the Committee via the "Public Comment" link.

My professional background is in engineering, education, research and grant writing. Currently, I am working on a grant for which I need demographic data for 2020. While looking at the Census Data for my grant, I decided to see what data was available for redistricting (https://www.census.gov/programs-surveys/decennial-census/about/rdo/summary-files.html). To my surprise, the only data points for re-districting were "Race". This is the only data that was presented to the people of Long Beach; but this is partial data. As of today, the Housing data is still partial with Occupancy (H1) the only data that is available.

So... the dataset for Housing is incomplete! There is no published 2020 data for "Living Quarters" at this time.

The Census states that "We the People" will have access to "experimental" data on November 30, 2021. This is not the final dataset!

If we compare the redistricting data points available today for 2020 versus the data points used for the 2010 redistricting, "We the people" (the citizens of Long Beach, CA) only have half of the data needed to make this crucial decision. So.... how can this redistricting, that will be voted on, be equitable to all???

Please remember, Public Law 94-171, enacted in 1975, says that data must be sent to Governors & Legislative leadership needed to redraw districts.

We have data, but does Long Beach, California have all of the "data points" needed to make this crucial decision???

My husband and I are working long hours and don't usually track emails. Unfortunately, the business regarding this important redistricting process is online (no mail was sent to our home regarding this); we now are addressing these important projects, which has implications for our area and us for the next 10 years.

In researching this process, we learned that redistricting also affects the number of seats in the House of Representatives for the 47th Congressional District. As we are reviewing all materials, as well as, looking at associated data, following are our thoughts that we are reiterating from our comments sent last week:

- We believe that the proposed redistricting will have adverse affects for Bixby Knolls as Bixby Knolls will be split in half according to our Census Tracts (CT):
- Bixby Knolls North CT 5715.02
- Bixby Knolls South CT 5719
- We did not purchase this property in Bixby Knolls in 1999 to be separated from the rest of the Bixby Knolls area. In the updated map, we are no longer referred to as Bixby Knolls. We feel we in many ways will be cut in half. Imagine how you would

feel this way as both north and south have a symbiotic relationship, which will be cut as we support businesses in the south but will no longer receive revenues for our district.

- We did not leave our city in 1999 to live in a city that is beginning to look like the communities we left. We do not want to live in an underserved community! We do not want to be disconnected to Bixby Knolls South (Census Track 5719). Without the rest of our community, we fear we will be moving towards being an underserved community! We do not want to deal with the problems and issues residents have with no help from our local government. Nor do we want our local government to steal from us what we worked so hard to attain.
- Proposed Bixby Knolls South (Census Track 5719) is part of our business district for which we shop and go to restaurants. The taxes these businesses pay are used for Bixby Knolls and the needs of District 8. Without this income for District 8 (due to redistricting), our community will have less access to needed services, which include infrastructure and repaving our streets, which would adversely affect our community.
- We are also concerned with our property values being compromised, as well as, safety in our community.
- We believe that this redistricting is a form of redistribution of wealth (removing wealth from Bixby Knolls North) by placing our business district in Bixby Knolls South. This redistricting will have an adverse affect on the middle class in this area.
- Lastly, when researching data from the 2020 Census, there is no data for redistricting in zip code 90807. Also North Long Beach received a community development Block Grant that did not benefit Bixby Knolls. Our neighbors have requested for or neighborhood streets to be fixed and re-paved. Yet we have been ignored!

Again, we do not want to be separated from the rest of Bixby Knolls!!! It is not in our best interest!!!

In addition to fair political representation, it is imperative the Black constituency in Central Long Beach are benefited by the federal funding that accompanies the Census results in the near and distant future designed to support residents and businesses. In my view, Map 2 does not negate the political needs, rather it acknowledges and embraces political needs of the Cambodian community. We are an industrial area and work with the Port of LB and the Westside Business Association of Long Beach which is on the other side of the LA River. We are all industrial areas that work very closely together and have for many, many years.

It is very important that we be able to continue to work together with the Port and the Westside as we have similar issues and situations that are now being addressed by our Council Office. My family and I settled into our Wrigley Heights home in Long Beach almost 2 years ago now. Getting to know the Wrigley neighborhoods, the local businesses there, churches and schools, We began to understand the tight-knit nature of this extremely diverse area of Long Beach. I write to urge the commission and City Council to move forward and approve Map 2, the map elevated by the Independent Redistricting Commission (IRC) entitled, "Proposed Final Map IRC Draft 2" (titled 1B on the document https://longbeach.gov/globalassets/redistricting/media-library/documents/maps/irc-draft-map-1b), which would reunite the South and North neighborhoods of Wrigley, Wrigley Heights and West Long Beach all in one district.

It's vital for the continued development of the entire Wrigley area and its struggling local businesses that we are unified under one district. Maps other than Map 2 are, in effect, fragmenting the rich heritage and culturally diverse communities of West Long Beach and Wrigley into 2 or 3 separate districts, denying us the power to elect a candidate of our choice.

Also, as much of a burden as splitting the districts in this community is laying the east district line right in the middle of arguably the most important commercial thoroughfare in the area: Pacific Ave. I would passionately request you to reconsider your boundary line that splits Pacific Avenue in half and ask that the east boundary be relocated to include the entirety of Pacific Ave from Willow Street to the Pacific Coast Highway into district "G" with the rest of the Wrigley neighborhoods. Good evening Commissioners and Staff,

My name is Maureen Neeley and I have been an active leader with both the Belmont Heights Community Association and Long Beach Heritage for over 20 years. I was gratified to have been called early on in the redistricting process by a Commissioner who wanted input on traditional district boundaries. I appreciated the attention to detail shown by the Commission.

I would like to speak to these traditional boundaries and advocate for a proposed map known as IRC Draft Map 2. In this map a number of Historic Districts are kept wholly within a Council District. This is important because the dilution of Historic Districts by dividing them between Council Districts weakens the voice of the residents.

Drilling down a bit deeper, I would note that keeping the Bluff Park Historic District attached to the same Council District as Belmont Heights provides the historic continuity of the original Alamitos Beach Townsite (conceived of by John Bixby in 1886, annexed by Long Beach in 1909). This Township ran from Alamitos to Termino. Today, Belmont Heights continues eastward to Nieto. Belmont Heights and Bluff Park have had over 100 years of continuity in terms of:

- Shared schools
- Shared shopping districts and bus lines
- Continuous bike lanes
- Street names that historically changed as each subdivision was annexed (i.e., Eliot to 3rd; Railway to Broadway)
- Housing stock (both neighborhoods are similarly defined by small apartments, bungalows, large residences integrated on each block)
- Public bluffs and shoreline, sharing the pros and cons of public access to the beach

IRC Draft Map 2 goes a long way in combining several historic/traditional districts under one or another Council District. It corrects the current splitting of Bluff Heights and Rose Park into different Council Districts. I am happy to see the attention paid to keeping districts together.

Good evening,

I am Dr. La Vonne Hamilton. My husband and I are homeowners in Bixby Knolls. We attended the November 3, 2021 meeting online and sent our response to the Committee via the "Public Comment" link.

My professional background is in engineering, education, research and grant writing. Currently, I am working on a grant for which I need demographic data for 2020. While looking at the Census Data for my grant, I decided to see what data was available for redistricting (https://www.census.gov/programs-surveys/decennial-census/about/rdo/summary-files.html). To my surprise, the only data points for re-districting were "Race". This is the only data that was presented to the people of Long Beach; but this is partial data. As of today, the Housing data is still partial with Occupancy (H1) the only data that is available.

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Please remember, Public Law 94-171, enacted in 1975, says that data must be sent to Governors & Legislative leadership needed to redraw districts.

We have data, but does Long Beach, California have all of the "data points" needed to make this crucial decision???

My husband and I are working long hours and don't usually track emails. Unfortunately, the business regarding this important redistricting process is online (no mail was sent to our home regarding this); we now are addressing these important projects, which has implications for our area and us for the next 10 years.

In researching this process, we learned that redistricting also affects the number of seats in the House of Representatives for the 47th Congressional District. As we are reviewing all materials, as well as, looking at associated data, following are our thoughts that we are reiterating from our comments sent last week:

- We believe that the proposed redistricting will have adverse affects for Bixby Knolls as Bixby Knolls will be split in half according to our Census Tracts (CT):
- Bixby Knolls North CT 5715.02
- Bixby Knolls South CT 5719
- We did not purchase this property in Bixby Knolls in 1999 to be separated from the rest of the Bixby Knolls area. In the updated map, we are no longer referred to as Bixby Knolls. We feel we in many ways will be cut in half. Imagine how you would

feel this way as both north and south have a symbiotic relationship, which will be cut as we support businesses in the south but will no longer receive revenues for our district.

- We did not leave our city in 1999 to live in a city that is beginning to look like the communities we left. We do not want to live in an underserved community! We do not want to be disconnected to Bixby Knolls South (Census Track 5719). Without the rest of our community, we fear we will be moving towards being an underserved community! We do not want to deal with the problems and issues residents have with no help from our local government. Nor do we want our local government to steal from us what we worked so hard to attain.
- Proposed Bixby Knolls South (Census Track 5719) is part of our business district for which we shop and go to restaurants. The taxes these businesses pay are used for Bixby Knolls and the needs of District 8. Without this income for District 8 (due to redistricting), our community will have less access to needed services, which include infrastructure and repaving our streets, which would adversely affect our community.
- We are also concerned with our property values being compromised, as well as, safety in our community.
- We believe that this redistricting is a form of redistribution of wealth (removing wealth from Bixby Knolls North) by placing our business district in Bixby Knolls South. This redistricting will have an adverse affect on the middle class in this area.
- Lastly, when researching data from the 2020 Census, there is no data for redistricting in zip code 90807. Also North Long Beach received a community development Block Grant that did not benefit Bixby Knolls. Our neighbors have requested for or neighborhood streets to be fixed and re-paved. Yet we have been ignored!

Again, we do not want to be separated from the rest of Bixby Knolls!!! It is not in our best interest!!!







- Has three districts, G, E, and D directly adjacent to Long Beach Airport


Problems:


- District G extends further south than at any point in its history, cuts off historical westside parts, segregates by wealth

- Too much land area, city resources and assets concentrated in district **E**


IRC Draft Map #2 Improvements:


- Better northwestern border for **D** *Problems:*
- District **H** still contorted, non-compact
- Segregates **G** to only the poorest, most vulnerable neighborhoods on Westside, = environmental apartheid
- Non-historical boundaries for A, eliminates power of B to affect Port
- Creates a new "superdistrict" in E that concentrates disproportionate number of parks and city assets = env'l apartheid
- Takes Community Hospital away from where in has always been in D, concentrates schools and parks in D
- Locks in the voting power, by CVAP, for incumbents/whites in A, B, C, D, E
- Wildly distorted shapes/ population shift
- Dilutes the Latino Vote throughout LB.








As is clearly evident, gerrymandering around principal city assets - the Port, Airport, and City/County facilities adjacent - has been concurrent with demographic changes since the 1991 redistricting in Long Beach. This is most clearly observable in the boundary shifts in **G**, **F**, and **D** along the southern Signal Hill border. It is important to recognize that many of the demographic shifts from 1991 to the present in these areas reflect historical redlining between PCH and Anaheim St., and the rapid growth in housing in the late 1970s/early 1980s. The City of Long Beach is currently anticipated, over the 2015-2025 period, to have a similar uptick in housing construction, centered in Transit Oriented Development neighborhoods along and adjacent to the Metro Blue Line, and in the Downtown area - districts **B**, **A**, **F**, **G**, **H** and **I**.

One of the clearest examples of the necessity for dual representation in the Port by districts **A** and **B** - on which former Councilman Evan Braude gave detailed testimony on community efforts to establish - is the increased pollution load that these communities, first and foremost, are at present affected by with the record number of container cargo ships (111 as of 10am 11/10/21) idling in the San Pedro Bay: one can easily smell the diesel fumes and particulates from City Hall (as of 9pm 11/09/21). Both the downtown and the southwesternmost districts need representation directly in the Port: district **A** boundaries should seek to retain industrial Piers S, T, C-F, and coastal access through the Back Channel to the Outer Harbor; and district **B** boundaries should include what is walkable south of Broadway St.

Where IRC Draft Map #1 did incorporate most of these criteria into district A, the population imbalance created by adding neighborhoods on the westside also results in direct problems for how to draw the adjacent district G, and what to do about access to the Long Beach Airport. These, and resultant problems that cascade along drawing districts that border Signal Hill, have occupied considerable time at the 10/27/21 and 11/03/21 IRC meetings, and have resulted in even more significant problems for IRC Draft Map #2.

They are soluble, if the commission is willing to consider where certain well-traveled surface roads that run through Long Beach - 7th St, PCH, Willow St. in particular - are boundaries that can and do bring neighborhoods and districts together as much as they separate them. This concept can be extended to other streets that clearly delineate neighborhoods - San Antonio Blvd., Temple St., Pacific Blvd., etc. - as often previous Redistricting Maps have utilized.

The IRC must avoid constructions that unfairly concentrate climate risks or environmental health burdens in districts on the westside of town, especially as these boundary constructions (**G**, **E**) are made at the behest, and for the benefit, of districts on the eastside of town that have some of the highest rates of incumbency in California. Note that those constructions also dilute the power of the Latino vote. It is possible to create a 2021 Long Beach City Council Redistricting Map that evenly balances population change, voting power, *AND* climate / environmental justice considerations, as one can see below in Map ID#70760 and Map ID#75241.

Recommendations:


- 1. Keep both unifying the Cambodian Community, and the Historical Black Community in the Central District, as coextensive as possible The IRC has done an admirable job balancing these delicate issues, with inherent tradeoffs between DM1 and DM2, but more public testimony, and balancing with other districts, is needed.
- 2. South St. as the border between the two districts in Northern Long Beach The IRC has incorporated this, recognizing these districts will have to trade population. For population balancing reasons throughout the rest of the map, it may be preferable to keep the Longwood, Coolidge Triangle, College Square, and Starr King Neighborhoods west of the LA River into the northernmost district.
- 3. Keeping Coastal Area communities together This was one of the first issues addressed after the release of IRC DM1, but IRC DM2 distributes out Bluff Park, Bluff Heights, and Carroll Park out of the southeasternmost district these neighborhoods belong in **C**.
- 4. Port needs to be represented by both communities it directly impacts Industrial facilities in Piers S-T, C-F should be added to the southwesternmost district, and the downtown district should retain Census Blocks along Pier H, Queen Mary, etc. that are walkable.
- 5. Airport needs to be represented by all three communities it directly impacts IRC DM 2 entirely misses the mark, save for the northwesternmost border of **D**, which should be retained. Without having to break up the large Census Block with the airport runways, all three districts adjacent to LGB can be distributed in a way that helps balance population, as well as neighborhoods, and direct access, and thus representation, in the Airport.
- 6. Balance Pollution Impacts on the Westside, and Freeway Corridors generally speaking, mobile sources of pollution from freeways, particularly where multiple freeways connect, can be as pollutive and harmful as the Port/Airport/Power Plants every neighborhood along the westside has a stake in what happens along the LA River and 710/Alameda Goods Movement Corridor. The 405/710 Interchange is a natural border between G, H.
- 7. New Homes = New Voters Along with balancing out pollution impacts on the westside, there is the added benefit of balancing out areas where there is appreciable anticipated growth, due to new housing construction, especially Transit Oriented Development. There are a number of districts that we can anticipate are undercounted two-fold, both in the Census, and in terms of new construction.
- 8. Evenly Distribute County and City Public Infrastructure: Hospitals, Schools, Parks, Fire Stations, the Water Department, the Gas and Oil department, etc. should not be over-concentrated in a handful of districts, or deprived from other districts.



9. Every District Must Compromise - The IRC should be explicit about how to balance priorities between Statutory Criteria and Public Testimony. Of particular concern here is balancing the Total Population, given problems with Census Data undercounting, as well as predictable growth and changes in CVAP from 2022-2028 as youth become voters.

However, map 1, with the amendment proposed last week that gives a portion of the airport to the district on the westside, accomplishes the same thing without breaking up the 5th district.

I support the original map 1 and ask that it be reconsidered/amended and made available as a candidate for the final map. That map is well balanced with natural boundaries and contains many asks and changes that came from the community. The majority of the people that provided maps for your consideration had similar boundaries to what exist today in district 5. Public input should matter.
