REVIEW OF GROUP AGREEMENTS & ROLE OF COMMISSION

COORDINATOR'S REPORT

Commission Coordinator Overholt reported that the department's budget request including staffing for an Office of Veterans Support continues to gain momentum and outlined a scope of discussion per the action item on said Office.

22-007VA Recommendation to discuss Office of Veterans Support.

Commissioners reported briefly on their outreach to their respective Council members to share the plan and garner support for the Office of Veterans Support (OVS). With a focus on reaching out to local organizations to support

and advocate for OVS, the Commission reviewed a spreadsheet listing more than 30 elected officials and Veteran-serving organizations. The document dates back to 2018, when the Commission began conducting interviews as part of the strategic planning process. A "whiteboard session" followed with Commissioners revising, updating and adding onto the list. Public comment on this item engaged guests who also contributed their edits and additions. Staff will revise and re-send out the spreadsheet and follow-up with Commissioners on missing information.

The Commission could host lunch-time conversations about the plan with Veterans at places like Cal State and LB City College. A participant made an important point: many Veterans organizations are struggling to survive and thrive now because of the pandemic.

A motion was made to establish an OVS *ad hoc* committee to research, review and report back on several items. Such a committee could consider the following questions and more. How does the Office of Sustainability and the Sustainability Commission operate? What is the mission and vision of the Office? What should its initial priorities be?
