Recommendation to authorize City Manager to renew the agreements (MOUs) with the California Department of Justice and U.S. Customs and Border Protection for a period of one year, with an option to renew for two additional years with City Manager approval, to continue their contracts for Law Enforcement Incineration of Controlled Substances at the Southeast Resource Recovery Facility (SERRF). (District 2)

Law enforcement agencies have determined that incineration is the most economical, legally feasible and, from a technological standpoint, the best method of destroying seized drugs that are no longer needed for legal proceedings. Currently, SERRF is one of two commercial incinerators within California permitted to burn controlled substances.

Due to its size, location, and adaptability to security, California's Attorney General requested the use of SERRF for the destruction of drugs seized by any law enforcement agency in California. Under an agreement last approved by the City Council on May 3, 2005 for the period July 2005 through June 2008, SERRF will have burned 1,450,000 pounds of controlled substances delivered by U.S. Customs and Border Protection and State and local law enforcement agencies.

It is proposed that these two separate agreements be extended another year through a contract from July 1, 2008 through June 30, 2009 (with a two-year renewal option) for the destruction of narcotics at SERRF: one with the California Department of Justice and another with the U.S. Customs and Border Protection. To keep administrative costs to a minimum, the City will bill flat rate billings of \$12,000 and \$75,000, respectively.

This matter was reviewed by Deputy City Attorney Amy Burton on March 12, 2008 and by Budget Management Officer Victoria Bell on March 17, 2008.

City Council action on this matter is requested on May 6, 2008, to ensure a contract is in place before

the current contract expires.

The \$87,000 revenue generated from the agreements will be deposited in the budget of the Long Beach Gas and Oil (EN) in the SERRF Enterprise Fund (EF 331). This revenue will be received during FY 08 and is already included in the adopted FY 08 Budget.
