Recommendation to authorize City Manager, or designee, to execute all necessary documents to receive and expend grant funding from the County of Los Angeles Real Estate Fraud Prosecution Program, for the period of July 1, 2018 to June 30, 2019; and

Increase appropriations in the General Grants Fund (SR 120) in the Police Department (PD) by \$60,000, offset by grant revenue. (Citywide)

On June 22, 2018, the Long Beach Police Department (LBPD) was awarded grant funding for the tenth consecutive year from the County of Los Angeles through the Real Estate Fraud Prosecution Program (Real Estate 18) grant in the amount of \$60,000. The grant provides funding for detective overtime hours assigned to real estate fraud investigation/prosecution, supplies and training.

This matter was reviewed by Deputy City Attorney Gary J. Anderson on July 16, 2018 and by Budget Management Officer Rhutu Amin Gharib on July 19, 2018.

City Council action is requested on August 7, 2018, to expedite the use of grant funds.

As this grant is currently unbudgeted, an appropriation increase in the General Grants Fund (SR 120) in the Police Department (PD) in the amount of \$60,000 is requested. Grant revenues will offset the expense appropriation and the grant does not require any matching funds. There is no local job impact associated with this recommendation.
