Recommendation to increase appropriations in the General Fund Group in the City Manager Department by \$1,000, offset by the Fourth Council District One-time District Priority Funds transferred from the Citywide Activities Department to provide support to The Little Lion Foundation (LLF) for their ongoing euthanasia-prevention efforts of small cats and kittens; and

Decrease appropriations in the General Fund Group in the Citywide Activities Department by \$1,000 to offset a transfer to the City Manager Department.

This matter has been reviewed by Recovery Budget Officer Dee Okam on March 9, 2023.

This recommendation requests the City Manager to provide a contribution to The Little Lion Foundation (LLF) for their ongoing euthanasia-prevention efforts of small cats and kittens. The total appropriation increase of \$1,000 in the General Fund Group in the City Manager Department will be offset by a decrease in appropriation of the Fourth Council District One-time District Priority Funds in the General Fund in the Citywide Activities Department. This recommendation is anticipated to require a minimal level of staff hours beyond the budgeted scope of duties and is expected to have minimal impact on existing City Council priorities. There is no local job impact associated with this recommendation.
